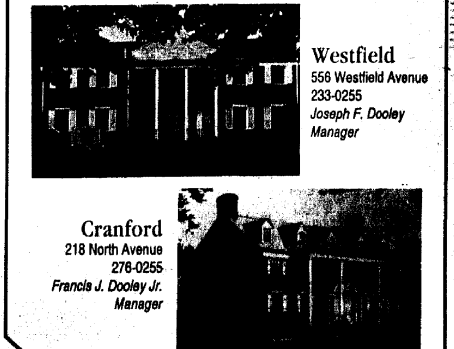
**Ann F. Barone, Active in Community; Past Judge of Local Election Board**
