Henry Martin Murphy, 101, died on Monday, April 9, at the Bristol Glen United Methodist Home in Newton.

Born in Hackensack, he had lived in Rutherford and Westfield for many years.

Mr. Murphy had been employed by the Elizabeth Board of Education, serving as chairman for the business department at Elizabeth High School. After his retirement he continued as a substitute teacher.

He received a Bachelor of Science degree and a master's degree in education from New York University.

A painter, Mr. Murphy belonged to the Westfield Art Association and the Newton Art League. On his 100th birthday, he had an art show in Newton, given by the Sussex County Art Society.

While a resident at Bristol Glen, he obtained ministers for the weekly chapel service and was the book-keeper for the Christian Outreach Program.

Elizabeth 'Bunte' Willard, 85, Was Nurse; Second Lieutenant During World War II

Mrs. Elizabeth Anne McGuire Willard, 85, of Westfield died on Wednesday, April 4, at Overlook Hospital in Summit.

Born in Jersey City, she was known throughout her life by her childhood nickname, Bunte, based on a lullaby called "Bye Baby Bunting," which she pronounced as Bun-tee.

Mrs. Willard lived in Westfield and Mountainside, as well as San Juan, Puerto Rico and San Francisco, Calif., before permanently settling in Westfield in 1953. She received her nursing degree from St. Joseph Hospital School of Nursing in Paterson.

Mrs. Willard was a second lieutenant in the United States Army during World War II. A beneficiary of the GI bill, she earned a Bachelor of Science in Nursing degree from Seton Hall University while working as a nurse, caring for two children and waiting for her Army officer husband to return from a combat assignment in Korea. She later received two master's degrees, one from Jersey City State College in health education and another from Kean University in social work.

For 20 years, until her retirement in 1985, she was a school nurse for the Westfield Board of Education. She was very active with the Westfield Education Association and was instrumental in getting the nurses in the school system on the same pay scale as the teachers. As a school nurse, she embraced her own role as a teacher and was responsible for developing and presenting courses in the then very controversial subject of sex education.

Mrs. Willard was a longtime member of the Westfield Welfare Board and provided hope and inspiration to those under her care. She also was active in the Woman's Club of Westfield and the Westfield Historical Society, and was a member of the Westfield United Fund. For more than
